

HAFFENDEN

FAMILY TREE

Arms: Chequy argent and sable, on a bend azure, three escutcheons of the first, each charged with a mullet of the second.

Crest: on a wreath of the colours, a gryphon's head erased sable, pendant from the beak an escutcheon argent, charged with a mullet sable.¹

"The Haffendens had lived at Haffenden Quarter between Biddenden and High Halden since the fourteenth century, and later at Bugglesden to the north-west of Tenterden."

History of Tenterden

"The Haffendens have been long resident in the county of Kent, at Tenterden and Smarden... Arms: Chequy, sa. and arg., on a bend, az., three mullets, or; crest: an eagle's head, coupéd."
