

# HAFFENDEN FAMILY TREE

*Arms: Chequy argent and sable, on a bend azure, three escutcheons of the first, each charged with a mullet of the second.*

*Crest: on a wreath of the colours, a gryphon's head erased sable, pendant from the beak an escutcheon argent, charged with a mullet sable.<sup>1</sup>*

*"The Haffendens had lived at Haffenden Quarter between Biddenden and High Halden since the fourteenth century, and later at Bugglesden to the north-west of Tenterden."*

*History of Tenterden*

*"The Haffendens have been long resident in the county of Kent, at Tenterden and Smarden, Halden-Bugglesden, in the north part of Borestile Borough, being anciently and up to a very recent period, their property and abode..."*

*Arms for Haffenden of Homewood: Chequy, sa. and arg., on a bend, az., three mullets, or; crest: an eagle's head, coupéd."*

*In addition to the Haffenden memorial beside the south porch inside St. Mildred's, Tenterden, the old Haffenden tombstones are in the churchyard to the north of the tower.*

**R**An[d]ulf de Hethindenne, son of Matilda, a knight of west Kent, joined the Third Crusade 1187–92. He occurs in charters (nos 30–6) to the monks of the Abbey of Robertsbridge, Sussex, relating to his fees in Hecthinden, also Croke, Wokele, etc., with disposals 'on his journey to Jerusalem', marked with his seal of an armed knight on horseback riding to the dexter, holding a pennon charged with a saltire cross, bearing the legend 'Ranulfe de Etindenne'.

In June 1222 his widow Clarice sold lands at Haffenden, Enock, Ockley, Siseley and Hugebroc in Tenterden and Hawkhurst, to Abbot Nicholas, of Robertsbridge (19 June 1222, Kent *Feet of Fines*). In 1242/3 Willelm de Hethindenn holds fees in Rolvinden from Orable de Meyhanm, who holds from the Countess of Eu (*Testa de Nevill*, Part 2). The surname seems to have been established by the late 13<sup>th</sup> century, when it occurs frequently in the Kent *Hundred Rolls* and *Lay Subsidy Rolls* 1274–1335.

**Laurence Hethenden**, of Bugglesden, occurs 1445–52, and was bailiff and landholder of Tenterden, Kent, in 1452. He may have been the father of,

Tenterden, 1480; d. after Oct. 1525); and he d. 1525 (will dated 24 October 1525, proved Archdeacon's Court, Canterbury, 11 Dec 1525<sup>4</sup>), buried St Mildred's, Tenterden (M.I. in south aisle with arms: *chequy ar. and sa., on a bend az. three mullets*), leaving:

- A10. Philip Haffenden.

### Second Generation

A8. **Robert Haffenden**, yeoman of Tenterden; b. Tenterden, 1516; married there on 12 May 1544, **Margareta Crottol** (b. Tenterden, 1523; d. Tenterden, bur. 13 Aug 1576), executrix under her husband's will, dau. of **John Crottol**, jurat of Tenterden,<sup>5</sup> by **Marina Felipe**; and he d. Tenterden, 1571, bur. St Mildred's (will dated 11 September 1571 proved Archdeacon's Court, Canterbury, 26 December 1571), leaving:

- B1. **John Haffenden**, who follows.
- B2. Alice Haffenden, b. Tenterden, Dec 1546 (PR); m. at Hawkhurst, Kent, 1567, William Pix, of Hawkhurst Place (?formerly of Yalding; see *Visitation of Kent*, 1619, p. 162, showing descent from William Pix of Hawkhurst); brought a petition for action to be taken against three men who attacked him at his home with weapons on 27 August 1597; ? accused of riotous behaviour, Kent Quarter Sessions, 3 September 1599 (buried at Hawkhurst 28 December 1609) (M.I. arms: *azure, a fess between three crosses-crosslet fitchée or; crest: on a chapeau [gules], turned up ermine, a cross-crosslet fitchée [argent], between two wings expanded [azure]*, as given in *Visitation*, 1619), will proved at Canterbury 3 February 1609/10.<sup>6</sup> She was buried in Hawkhurst, 11 September 1602, leaving with other issue (seven children):
  - C1. Marian Pix, baptised at Tenterden, 31 July 1569.
  - C2. George Pix, baptised at Tenterden, 9 December 1571; of Benenden; gentleman; married firstly, Anne Gibbon, daughter of Henry Gibbon, of Benenden (buried in

John Crothole 'the elder', son of Robert, occurs in Tenterden in 1479 (Fuljambe deeds DD FJ/1/142/5) and d. Tenterden 1496. He had by Mary his wife some four sons: Robert, John, Stephen and Laurence. John, sometime jurat of Tenterden, m. Marina Felipe 6 September 1548 and had Margareta, who m. Robert Haffenden.

Hawkhurst church 21 August 1627); married secondly (by licence dated 24 January 1630/1) at Benenden, 27 January 1630/1, Margaret Whetcombe, ?née Halden, widow of John Whetcombe, of Halden; he was buried in Hawkhurst church January 1638/9 (will proved at Canterbury 26 February 1638/9; inventory dated 25 January 1638/9 totalling personal estate at £349 16s. 9d.); leaving issue, four sons and three daus.

Robert Haffenden, the first of Bugglesden; baptised at Tenterden, 8 April 1554 (PR); inherited house and lands, a black steer, a red steer, two ewes and a feather bed with bedding under his father's will, 1571; jurat and J.P. of Tenterden; witnessed the will of his brother-in-law Nicholas Burwash, 23 September 1601, signing by mark; conveyed lands at Tenterden to William Pix, his brother-in-law, 8 July 1605; married at High Halden, 28 November 1583, Sarah Burwash (she married secondly at Tenterden, 2 November 1614, Stephen Huckstepp, widower [born circa 1548, buried at Tenterden 20 June 1633], 'a very ancient man' and she died at Tenterden *circa* 1626), daughter of Thomas and Issard Burwash, of Egerton, Kent. Robert died 1613/4; buried at Tenterden, 23 January 1613/4 (PR); will dated 7 November 1613, proved at Canterbury, 25 February 1613/4 (vol. 57, fol. 428), leaving:
- C1. (A son), buried at Tenterden, 6 September 1584, unbaptised (PR).
- C2. Alice Haffenden, baptised at Tenterden, 31 January 1585 (PR); buried there 2 February 1591/2 (PR).
- C3. Sarah Haffenden, baptised at Tenterden, 10 February 1588/9 (PR); witness to the will of her brother, George Haffenden, 20 June 1644; married there 13 January 1607 (PR) Stephen Iggleden (baptised at Biddenden 16 April 1582; will dated 24 October 1624, proved Consistory Court Canterbury, vol. 45, folio 138, 30 Nov 1624), of Biddenden, clothier; and by him had with seven other children (two of whom emigrated to Massachusetts Bay Colony, 1634–8):

Susan Iggleden, born *circa* 1618; mentioned in her father's will, 1624; married at Tenterden, 20 September 1638 (PR) Thomas Haffenden (baptised at Tenterden, 25 May 1617 [PR]); son of Garrett Haffenden and Amy née Swift; possibly the one of this name buried at Tenterden, 10 December 1652 (PR); and by him had six children, all baptised Tenterden.
- D2. Elizabeth Iggleden, born *circa* 1620; mentioned in her father's will, 1624; emigrated to America aboard *Hercules* in 1634; married at Roxbury, Massachusetts, in April 1641, Philip Meadows, and was ancestress of J. Calvin Coolidge, 30<sup>th</sup> President of the USA.
- C4. Robert Haffenden, baptised at Tenterden, 13 October 1590 (PR); buried there, 20 January 1591/2 (PR).
- C5. John Haffenden, baptised at Tenterden, 3 December 1592 (PR); inherited lands, tenements and woods at Biddenden and 20 acres called Ilcherden at Halden under his father's will, 1613; clothier of Tenterden, and later of Heathfield, Sussex; administrator to his brother Robert's estate, 8 February 1630; married at St Benet's, Paul's Wharf, London, 29 July 1620 Elizabeth Gransden, née Markwick, widow of William Gransden (whom she had married at Mayfield, Sussex, 10 December 1617); her second husband's executrix, 1630; will dated 22 February 1642 proved Archdeaconry of Lewes, 21 March 1643 (Bundle U1, fol. 112). John Haffenden died at Brightling, Sussex, 1630, having made a nuncupative will (proved P.C.C. 9 June 1630 [Prob 11/157]), and leaving issue:
- D1. Jurat George Haffenden, m. Mary Marsh; will pr. 1648.
- D2. John Haffenden.
- D3. Sarah Haffenden.
- D4. Robert Haffenden.

Thomas Haffenden, baptised at Tenterden, 13 February 1596/7 (PR); inherited Bugglesden estate with 'all those parcels of lands and woodlands commonly called Bugglesden containing 50 acres in the parish of Tenterden and which I lately purchased of Mr. Francis Boddenden alias Bodenson' from his father, 1613/4; of Tenterden, 1653; executor to his son, 1653, and as such, of the will of his nephew George Haffenden of Brenzett; of Mersham, yeoman, 1667; of Boresile Borough, five hearths, 1664; married Joan, [cf Thomas Haffenden, married at St Clement's, Hastings, Sussex, 28 July 1617 Joan Burchett]; (she was probably buried at Tenterden, 27 August 1665 [PR]); possibly his second wife; Thomas was probably the one of that name buried at Tenterden, 19 February 1670/1 (PR), leaving issue (his eldest son John predeceased him in July 1653 and the Bugglesden estate possibly passed to his two daughters):

- D8. James Haffenden 'the Elder', bapt Tenterden, 8 Feb 1634/5 (PR); m. Elizabeth, and d. (will dated 8 Oct 1700; pr. Canterbury 6 Nov 1700), and had:  
E1. James Haffenden, b. 1671; m. Sept 1702 Elizabeth How; and d. Tenterden 24 Mar 1709/10 (bur. Tenterden, where his headstone remains), having had:

Tenterden 31 July 1703; m. by licence dated 31 Oct 1728 at St Paul's Cathedral, as his 2<sup>nd</sup> husband Jurat Samuel Curteis, armiger, sometime Mayor of Tenterden (bapt Tenterden 21 Oct 1697; see Curteis of Tenterden, *Visitation of Kent*, 1619, p. 89), and had issue seven children.  
F2. Elizabeth Haffenden, bapt Tenterden, 30 Jan 1704.  
F3. Jurat James Haffenden (see *Burke's L.G.*, 1852 ed.), of Homewood (which he built, see Halstead's *County of Kent*, 1798); m. Elizabeth, 3<sup>rd</sup> dau. of Richard Beale, of River Hall, Biddenden (see *sub* Neame, and *Burke's Extinct Baronetcies*: Beale of Maidstone), and d. in 1783, having had:  
G1. James Haffenden, who predeceased his father.  
G2. Richard Haffenden, of Homewood, jurat, JP, mayor of Tenterden, 1776; b. 1737; m. Tenterden, 6 Jun 1773, Elizabeth, third dau. of John Elmestone, of Rolvenden, and d. 1791 (will pr. PCC 6 Feb 1792), leaving (with two daus, Eliza and Sarah, and a son Richard, who all three d.s.p.) an only son and heir:  
H1. James Haffenden, of Homewood and Clearwell Court [Castle], Gloucestershire, capt in the Notts Militia; b. 1 Jan 1788; m. 23 Jan 1818, Catherine, dau. of Joseph Walker, of Eastwood House, York; and d. Langford Hall, Newark, 1833 (see *Burke's History of the Commoners*, 1836), leaving:  
I1. Alfred Haffenden, capt. 8<sup>th</sup> Hussars, of Langford Hall and Waplinton Hall, Yorks; b. 2/3 Jan 1825; bapt at Newland, Glos, 12 Jan 1825; m. Caroline Sarah Croft (d. 10 Sept 1848, aged 32), dau. of Admiral Croft; and d. 11 Jan 1871 (buried in Yorks), leaving 2 surviving daus and co-heirs:  
J1. Charlotte Isabella Haffenden, m. 1870 Rev. John Wilson-Haffenden (b. 1836; d. Fulham, 23 Apr 1895), sometime vicar of Stillington, Yorks; of Homewood and of Waplinton Hall; obtained a Royal Licence, 23 Dec 1871 (College of Arms, Ms: I 64/164) to assume the name Haffenden in addition to that of Wilson; received a grant of arms, 7 Feb 1872 (College of Arms, Ms: Grants 58/76): *chequy argent and sable on a bend azure three escutcheons of the first, each charged with a mullet of the second; crest: a gryphon's head erased sable, pendent from the beak an escutcheon argent charged*

  - C4. George Haffenden, yeoman of Smarden; inherited his father's house in Frittenden; occurs ecclesiastical cause papers, 1630 (DCb/J/J/52/73); will proved at Canterbury, 1642 (AS A227 and A 234); no issue.
  - C5. Robert Haffenden; inherited from his father £150 and a house, land and all plant necessary for the trade of a clothier; married; and he and his wife d. before 1640, having had:
    - D1. John Haffenden, clothier, baptised at Smarden, 2 April 1620 (IGI); licence dated 27 June 1640, being then aged upwards of 20, bachelor, his parents both dead, to marry at Smarden or Headcorn, Mary Swift (born *circa* 1611), daughter of Frances Swift, widow, of Smarden, spinster; she married secondly his cousin-germain George Haffenden (see *infra*); and John by her had Frances and John, both mentioned in their father's probate accounts, 1644.
    - D2. Mary Haffenden, mentioned in her uncle's will, 1642.
  - C6. **Sander Haffenden**, who follows.

By 1435 after Joan’s death, Dansey became a feoffee of her son-in-law, James Butler, earl of Ormond (husband of her daughter Joan) (CPR, 1429–36, p. 506; GEC, x, p. 125) and delivered seisin of manor or Haselbeche, Northants, to James Butler. A few months later, he conveyed Lady Abergavenny’s manor of Ashby de la Zouche to Humphrey Duke of Gloucester (HMC, Hastings, I, p. 1) and was enfeoffed with lands in Essex, with reversion to the same James Butler. Much of John Sr’s declared annual income in 1436 must have been derived from annuities, for when John Jr’s Inquisition *post mortem* was taken in 1496, the net value of his land in Somerby and Little Dalby was only £7 16s.
