of Llanarth and Treowen, co. Monmouth



Arms. — *Per pale, azure and gules, three lions rampant argent.*

Crest. — *A Saracen woman's head affronté couped at the shoulders with long hair sable, from the ears double rings pendent or, veil azure, doubled argent, wreathed across the forehead.*

Motto. — *Asgre lan diogel ei pherchen* ('A pure conscience is a safeguard to its possessor').

Jenkin ap Adam,¹⁰⁵ of Llanvapley and Wernddu, co. Monmouth; living temp. Edw. III and Richard II, an official 'magister serviens' of the lordship of Abergavenny; m. **Gwenllian**, dau. of Sir **Aaron ap Bledn**, of Gilsant, and left issue:

B. **William [Gwilym] ap Jenkin**, b. Wernddu *c.* 1327; Lord of Wernddu in 1353 and Cefyn-y-ddwy-glwyd, Llantilio, Pertholey, near Monmouth, living temp. Edw. III, m. **Gwenllian**, dau. and heir of **Howel Fychan [Ichon] ap Howel ap Iorworth**, of Cefyn-y-ddwy-glwyd, and d. Perth Hir *c.* 1377, having had 4 sons:

C1. John, or Jenkin ap Gwilym, of Wernddu, ancestor of family of Morgans of Llanfihangel and Progers of Llanmaes.

C2. David ap Gwilym ap Jenkin, *jure uxoris* of the Chapel in Abergavenny, m. Anne, dau. of Watkin Ress, of that place, ancestor of Jones of Trostre, Morgan of Triley, and Morgan of Arxton, extinct in the male line in the 17th century.

C3. **Howell ap Gwilym**, of whom presently.

C4. Thomas ap Gwilym, Kt., of Perthyr, Monmouth, m. Maud, dau. and co-heir of Sir John Morley, Kt., Lord of Raglan Castle, and acquired thereby Llansaintfraed, bur. 8 July 1438. His youngest son:

¹⁰⁵ The conventional early descent is given here. Jenkin ap Adam is sometimes stated to be the son of Adam FitzHerbert, lord of Llanllowell and Bettesley, son of Herbert fitz Peter (b. *c.* 1275); Adam's wife is given as Cristyn ferch Gwarin Dhu (descended from Ynyr, king of Upper Gwent 1030). Several more or less spurious early descents have been adduced. In the C15, Hywel Lloyd, commissioned by King Edward IV, traced a pedigree to Lord Herbert, Duke of Cornwall, son of Godwin. A descent is given from Herbert, Lord Chamberlain to King William Rufus, who m. Emma, dau. of Stephen, count of Blois (*John of Hexham*, ed. Thomas Arnold, 1882–8, vol. 2, 305–7). A Norman descent from Herbert the Chamberlain (of Henry I), a descendant of Herbert, Count of Vermandois 1035, is often cited (T. Nicholas, *Counties and County Families of Wales*, vol ii, pp. 776–77). Recently, Darrell Wolcott in 'The Herbert Family Pedigree' has given a plausible descent from Adam Gwent (Bradney, vol. 3, pt 2, 218), a nobleman of Welsh ancestry, possibly a cadet of the rulers of Gwent in the tenth and eleventh centuries.

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- D1. Sir William ap Thomas, Kt., alias Herbert, 'the Blue Knight of Gwent', of Raglan Castle, co. Monmouth (he acquired freehold of the manor from his stepson, James, first Lord Berkeley, 1432, when he may have begun the reconstruction of the Castle); knighted by Henry V at Agincourt 1426; m. 1st 1406 Elizabeth Bloet (d. 24 May 1419), dau. of Sir John Bluet of Raglan and Daglingworth, Glos, widow of Sir James Berkeley of Berkeley Castle, Glos; m. 2nd Gwladys Ddu (d. 1454), the dau. of Sir Daffyd Gam, Kt. (and widow of Roger Vaughan of Bredwardine), and d. 1445 (bur. St Mary's Priory, Abergavenny; monument with effigies to himself and wife Gwladys), having had issue five children from whom derived the Herberts Earls of Powis, the Herberts of Coldbrook, the Herberts Lords of Cherbery, the Herberts of Muckcross, co. Kerry, the Herberts of St Julians, etc.

G1. **John ap Thomas**, of Treowen; m. 1481/3 **Anne**, dau. and heiress of **David ap Gwilliam Morgan**, of Arxton, Kingstone, Herefs, and had:
H1. **William ap John Thomas** (or Jones), of Hendre Obaith, Castle Arnold, Llanarth, Cefn Dugfoid and Treowen, standard bearer to Henry VIII, High Sheriff of Monmouth 1556, and the first of his family to assume the name Jones, left issue by 4 wives and at least one concubine:

K1. **Sir Philip Jones**, of Treowen, Lt-Col of Royalist forces in the Civil War; MP Monmouth 1653; High Sheriff of Monmouth 1642–3; b. c. 1602; m. **Elizabeth Morgan**, dau. of **Sir Edward Morgan**, 1st Bt. [1642], of Llantarnam Abbey, Mon., sheriff of Monmouthshire 1644–5 and Royalist (grandson of **Edward Somerset**, 4th Earl of Worcester, and a descendant of Blessed **Margaret Pole**, cr. Countess of Salisbury, 'the last of the Plantagenets'), by **Mary**, dau. of **Sir Francis Englefield**, 1st Bt [1611], of Wotton Bassett, Wilts.; and d. 9 Mar 1660 (will dated 7 Mar 1659), having had with two other sons and nine daus, an eldest son:

- O1. **Philip Jones**, of Llanarth Court, b. 22 Jan 1723; m. **Katherine Wyborne** (b. Hawkwell, Kent, c. 1727; d. 1769), dau. of **John Wyborne** of Hawkwell Place, Kent, by his wife **Anne**, dau. of **Richard Perkins** of Ufton and Beenham, Berks; and he d. 16 May 1782, leaving issue, a son:

- O3. **William Jones**, of Clytha House, which he purchased from his brother-in-law and where he built the folly of Clytha Castle; b. 1733/4; m. 6 July 1767, **Elizabeth Morgan** (b. 29 Mar 1729; d.s.p. 14 Jan 1787), dau. of Sir **William Morgan**, KB, of Tredegar, by **Rachel**, dau. of **William Cavendish**, 2nd Duke of Devonshire; he d.s.p. 1805/8.
- O4. **Mary Jones**, b. 1731; m. at Llanarth 1 Dec 1767 **Richard Lee** (d. Pisa 1820), of Clytha (which he sold to his brother-in-law **William Jones**) and Llanfoist, Monmouth, and of Great Delce, nr Rochester, Kent, and had:

Ursula Wyrwood, dau. of Wartle Wyrwood, of Boston, Lincs., and was grandfather of Thomas Jones, Archbishop of Dublin and Lord Chancellor of Ireland (b. 1550; d. 1650), and great-grandfather of Sir Roger Jones of Durham's Town, 1st Lord Jones of Navan and 1st Viscount Ranelagh (d. 1628).

H3. Morgan Jones of Crossland, who m. and had issue.

H4. Richard Jones of Pembrokeshire, who m. Alice [Jones] of Bawdry, Pembs, and d. 1546/7 leaving issue.

P1. The above-mentioned **John Jones**, of Llanarth Court (which he rebuilt *c.* 1793), Treowen, nr Wonastow, and Penllwyn, all co. Monmouth, and of Ufton, county Berks (which estate he inherited from John Perkins, d. 1769); born at Llanarth, 1760; m. at Llanfoist 18 Sept 1789 his first cousin **Mary Lee** (died, aged 84, at Clifton, co. Gloucester, 4 April, bur. in the crypt of the Church of the Holy Apostles, Clifton, 10 April 1855), eldest dau. and co-heiress (with her sisters, Elizabeth and Apollonia, above) of **Richard Lee**, of Clytha and Llanfoist Ho., co. John Jones died, aged 69, at Llanarth 29 June, bur. there 5 July 1828 (M.I.) (his will dated 3 March 1824, codicil 19 Feb. 1828, was proved 5 Dec. 1829, 715 Liverpool), having had:

He marr. at St. Mary's, Marylebone, London, 11 June 1833, Frances, eldest dau. of Edward Huddleston, of Sawston Hall, Cambridge, and of Purse Caundle, Dorset, by Sarah (Barton) his wife; and she died 1 Jan., bur. in the private Cemetery at Clytha, 5 Jan. 1878, having had issue:

Josephine Lucy Frances Marie Herbert, born and bapt. in Paris; marr. at the Church of the Assumption, Warwick Street, London, 22 July 1873, Morgan Stuart Williams, of Aberpergwm, Glamorgan, descendant of Morgan ap Caradoc ap Iestyn, the 12th-century lord of Nedd-Afan, and owner of 3,917 acres in Glamorgan and Brecknockshire in 1871 (born 25 January 1845; d. 13 Nov 1905), son of William Williams, of Aberpergwm, by Matilda his wife, only dau. and heir of Colonel Smith of Castella, Glamorgan, and of Peterhouse,

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- Cambridge; J.P. for counties of Brecknock and Glamorgan; she d. 31 May 1928, having had issue.
- R4. Marie Louise Herbert, born in Paris, and bapt. there; marr. at Llanarth 8 [?or 15] Feb. 1864, Capt. Sir John Walter Smythe, 8th Bart., of Acton Burnell, Salop; J.P. for Monmouth (born 7 Nov. 1827; d. at Acton Burnell 5 Mar 1919, devising and bequeathing his real and personal estate to his wife), 4th son of Sir Edward Joseph Smythe, 6th Bart., of Acton Burnell, by Frances, dau. of Sir Edward Bellew, 6th Bart., of Barmeath, co. Louth, and sister of Patrick, 1st Baron Bellew, so cr. 1848 (see above); she d. Shropshire 27 Mar 1929, ?having had:
- S1. Sir Edward Walter Joseph Patrick Herbert Smythe, 9th and last Baronet, b. 20 Mar 1869; d.s.p.m. 9 Mar 1942, when the baronetcy became extinct.

- Q7. Thomas Jones, born 17 April 1808, and bapt. the same day at Llanarth; died 3 August, bur. at Llanarth 7 August 1828.
- Q8. Mary Jones, born 23 March, bapt. 27 March 1793, baptism registered at Llanarth; marr. there 25 June 1821, Simon Thomas Scrope, of Danby Hall, co. York (eldest son of Simon Scrope, of Danby, by Catherine Dorothy, dau. of Edward Meynell, of Kilvington, and the Fryerage, Yarm, co. York); born 17 April 1790; died at Danby 1 Oct., bur. in the vault at Ulshaw 8 Oct. 1872. His will dated 14 March 1870, proved (Prin.
