Arms: *Or, two boars' tusks entire gules in pale issuant sinister.*⁸⁹
Crest: *on a wreath of the colours, in front of two azure-pointed tilting-spears sable in saltire and between two of the last in pile with banners displayed gules, a chaplet proper bearing an eagle displayed or.*

Melchior de Ontiveros [Hontiveros] of Avila, Spain, son of **Franco de la Reina** by **Elena Canelas**, served with Nuño de Guzmán in the Conquest of Western Mexico, 1529–. By 1564, Baltazar de Ontiveros was established as one of the first ranchers in northern Nueva Vizcaya. In 1597, Juan, son of Juan de Ontiveros, of Durango, took part in Juan Oñate's expedition to New Mexico.
