

### 3. *The Mexican Descent*

#### Ontiveros

Melchior de Ontiveros of Avila, Spain, son of Franco de la Reina by Elena Canelas, served with Nuño de Guzmán in the Conquest of western Mexico, 1529–. By 1564, Baltazar de Ontiveros was one of the first ranchers in northern Nueva Vizcaya. In 1597, Juan, son of Juan de Ontiveros, of Durango, took part in Juan Oñate's expedition to New Mexico. General Cristóbal de Ontiveros (who m. Maria, dau. of Capitán Pedro Sáez de Cháves [d. ante 1633] by Maria Rodríguez) and his brother Capitán Juan de Ontiveros, alcalde mayor of Cuatro Ciénegas, were among the principal land-holders of Nueva Vizcaya in the 17<sup>th</sup> century. Christóval de Ontiveros and Maria Sáez had a son, Juan, who m. in Zacatecas 20 Dec. 1663 Lorenza de Sosa.

**Pedro de Ontiveros** was b. Durango, Nueva Vizcaya, 1650, and m. at San Juan Bautista de Analco, Victoria de Durango, 24 Feb 1675 **Anna de Ybarra** (b. 1654).<sup>5</sup> Their son **Pedro de Ontiveros** m. **Maria Flores de Rivera** at San Pedro Apostolico Nombre de Dios, Durango, 23 Sept 1694, and had:

1. **Marcos Bernardo de Ontiveros Flores**, bapt Nombre de Dios, Durango, 3 May 1696; m. El Sagrario Metropolitano, Victoria de Durango, 3 Oct 1728, **Maria Efigenia de Guadalupe y Soto** (dau. of Domingo de Guadalupe by Nicolasa de Soto [who m. Durango 7 May 1699], bapt El Sagrario Metropolitano, Durango, 9 Feb 1701), and had:
  - i. **Ysabel Luisa Josepha de Ontiveros y Soto**, bapt Nombre de Dios, Durango, 11 Sept 1729; m. Durango 9 Jan 1751 (Juan) **Francisco Burgos**, and had:
    - a. Francisco Antonio Burgos, bapt Durango 21 Oct 1751.
    - b. (Maria) **Josefa de la Luz Burgos de Ontiveros**, bapt El Sagrario Metropolitano, Durango, 27 Nov 1752; m. El Sagrario Metropolitano, Durango, 25 Dec 1768, **Juan Bautista Ugarte** (of Erandio, Vizcaya), who had settled in Durango in the mid-18<sup>th</sup> cent., of whom hereafter.
2. Pedro de Ontiveros Flores, bapt Nombre de Dios, Durango, 26 Jan 1698.
3. Maria de Ontiveros Flores, bapt Nombre de Dios, Durango, 2 Jun 1699.
4. Pedro Joachin de Ontiveros Flores, bapt Nombre de Dios, Durango, 28 Oct 1700.
5. Joseph Policarpo de Ontiveros Flores, bapt Nombre de Dios, Durango, 4 Apr 1703.
6. Martin Thadeo Ontiveros Flores, bapt Nombre de Dios, Durango, 30 Nov 1705.

The aforesaid Juan Bautista Ugarte and Maria Josefa Burgos Ontiveros had:

1. Joseph Francisco Gerardo Ugarte de Burgos, bapt Durango 7 Oct 1769.

2. (**Maria Josepha**) **Feliciana Ugarte de Burgos**, bapt El Sagrario Metropolitano, Victoria de Durango, 23 Nov 1781; m. same place 1 Jun 1802 **Tomás de Balmaceda**, and had:
  1. Sebastián de Balmaceda y Ugarte, m. Mexico DF 27 Apr 1855 Laura Iribarren.
  2. Nicolas José Antonio de Balmaceda y Ugarte, bapt El Sagrario Metropolitano, Victoria de Durango, 11 Sept 1806.
3. (**Maria**) **Francisca Josefa de Balmaceda y Ugarte**, bapt. El Sagrario Metropolitano, Victoria de Durango, 17 Sept 1803; m. El Sagrario Metropolitano, Victoria de Durango, 5 Apr 1824 **Diego Redo** (of Spain), merchant and landowner settled in Durango, son of **Juan Ignacio Redó** (of ?Valls, Catalonia) by **María de las Nieves Rivadeneyra** (of Galicia); and had:
  - i. (**María**) Ygnacia Gabina Redo y de Balmaceda, b. Hidalgo del Parral, Chihuahua 20 Feb 1825; m. San Juan Bautista de Analco, Victoria de Durango, 30 Oct 1846 Angel Juan Belz, of Spain.
  - ii. (**Maria**) **Ramona Redo y de Balmaceda**, b. Cincinnati, USA, 14 Oct 1830; m. in Durango 15 Dec 1847 (Christian) **Heinrich Eduard Friedrich Störzel** (b. Grabow 26 Sept 1819; d. Hamburg 2 Apr 1885), Consul General of Mecklenburg-Schwerin in Mazatlán, son of Georg Heinrich Störzel (b. Ludwigslust 28 Jan 1782; d. Schwerin 15 Nov 1863) (who was Privy Counsellor and Finance Minister to the Grand-Duke Friedrich Franz of Mecklenburg-Schwerin until 1848), by his wife **Juliane Passow** (b. Grabow 26 Mar 1791; d. Schwerin 17 Feb 1869). Ramona d. Brannenburg station 23 Oct 1913 having had issue three daughters:
    - a. (**María**) Anita Gertrudis Störzel, b. Mazatlán, Mexico, 2 Mar 1850; m. Hamburg 4 Nov 1871 Major-General Enno Wilhelm von Conring (b. Zachow, Pomerania, 15 May 1829; d. Wiesbaden 28 May 1886); and she was murdered Hamburg 18 Dec 1920, having had one son and 2 daus [see sub Störzel].
    - b. (**Ramona Luisa**) **Clara Ignacia Störzel**, b. Grabow 2 Jun 1852; m. 3 May 1872 **Eduard Mathias Brödermann** (b. Hamburg 27 Feb 1842; d. 28 Feb 1904), yr son of Carl Matthias Brödermann (b. Hamburg 28 Feb 1789; d. Eimsbüttel 10 Jun 1854) by his 2<sup>nd</sup> wife **Marianne Kunhardt** (b. 10 Mar 1815; d. Eimsbüttel 23 Feb 1882), dau. of Geo. Wilhelm Kunhardt; and she d. Hamburg 24 Jun 1939, having had with 2 daus:

6. Maria Filomena Josefa Balmaseda Ugarte, bapt. 7 July 1813 at Sagrario Metropolitano, Durango; d. unm.

(José) Joaquín Ygno. Redo y de Balmaceda, landowner of El Dorado, Sinaloa; b. Durango 30 Mar 1833; Senator for Sinaloa and Secretary to President of Mexico, General Porfirio Díaz; m. Culiacán 1864 Alejandra de la Vega (b. Culiacán), daughter of Antonio de la Vega (descended from el capitán don Baltazar de la Vega y Colón de Portugal, a cadet of the family of the Dukes of Veragua and the Braganza kings of Portugal, who settled in Culiacán, *c.* 1777) by his wife (and first cousin) Beatriz de la Vega y Díez Martínez.

(José) Joaquín Redo y de Balmaceda d. Mazatlán 1904, having had:

1. Diego Redo de la Vega; died an infant.
2. Joaquín Alejandro Redo de la Vega, bapt. Mazatlán 31 Jul 1867; murdered in the Mexican Revolution.
3. (María) Beatriz Francisca Redo de la Vega, b. Durango 6 Oct 1868; m. Mexico 23 May 1891 Juan Zaldívar y Flóres (b. Mexico 20 Feb. 1863; d. ante 1908), Deputy in Union Congress and son of José María Soldívar y Balberi (1819–1898) (minister of Public Works and member of Junta of Notables before the fall of the Emperor Maximilian of Mexico, 1863); and by him had:
  - i. María Magdalena Beatriz Rosario Carmen Zaldivar Flores Redo, bapt. Mexico DF 24 Jan 1893, m. *c.* 1916 Llamosa.
4. (José Julio Alverto) Diego Redo de la Vega, b. 9 Dec 1869; bapt. Mazatlán 11 Feb 1870; Governor of the State of Sinaloa 1909–11; m. Culiacán 1916 María Teresa Vidal Soler y Costa, of Sta María de' Liguori (where the tomb of Count Giovanni Costa, an ancestor, can be seen in the church), and d. Mexico City 13 Jan 1963, having had issue:
  - i. Joaquín Redo y Vidal Soler; m. 1944 Marita Martínez del Río y [Hernández de] Henestrosa (of the family of the Marqués de Camaraza, and a first cousin of the Duchess of Medinacelli, of the Duchess of Lerma, and of the Marquesa of Santa Cruz), and had issue Joaquín.
  - ii. (María) Teresa Redo y Vidal Soler; m. Juan Sánchez-Navarro y Peón (descended from Carlos Sánchez-Navarro y Beraín, Grand Chamberlain of the Emperor Maximilian), and d. 2004, and had issue.
  - iii. Beatriz Redo y Vidal Soler; m. Luís de Yturbe y Limantour (whose grandfather, José Yves Limantour, was Minister of Finance during the government of General Porfirio Díaz, and who is related to the Beistegui family).
  - iv. Diego Redo y Vidal Soler; m. Norma Hoeffler Fierio y Merry del Val (related to the family of Rafael, Cardinal Merry del Val, of Spain), and d. 1998.
  - v. Alejandro Redo y Vidal Soler, of Eldorado, Sinaloa; m. Norma Rodríguez-Familiar y Benson (dau. of Governor of the state of Querétaro, 1933–40).
5. (José) Alejandro Redo y de la Vega, b. 17 Jan 1873; bapt Mazatlán 30 Jun 1873; Governor of the State of Sinaloa, 1925–8.
