Arms: *Quarterly, per fesse raguly ermine and azure, two barrulets between four lions' heads erased, all countercharged.*

Crest: *In front of a staff raguly fessewise azure, a demi-heraldic antelope argent, armed or, gorged with a gemel, also azure, and pierced through the shoulder with an arrow in bend sinister proper.*⁴⁵

Motto: *Ne a meta oculos avertam*
